Navigating the COVID-19 Crisis

This is a challenging time for all of us, but we want you to know that Neighbor Ride is still there for you. Our staff is safely working from home and the phones are manned during our regularly scheduled office hours. We are currently providing essential medical rides and will return to offering rides for banking, grocery shopping, and other needs in accordance with guidance from county officials.

Pivoting to Meet New Needs

As it became clear that social distancing guidelines implemented to mitigate the impact of the COVID-19 crisis would be both far-reaching and long-term, Neighbor Ride put measures in place to ensure that essential medical rides could continue to be provided and proactively made plans to pivot our transportation program to one that could also accommodate essential food deliveries. As usual, our volunteers eagerly responded to the call for help and by the first week of April were providing food deliveries to Howard County Food Bank clients throughout the county. In the following weeks, Neighbor Ride and its drivers extended their delivery support to the Howard County Office on Aging & Independence, Head Start, and Public School System Grab & Go meal programs that are serving a growing number of vulnerable individuals and families in our community.

To date, Neighbor Ride's volunteers have made over 250 deliveries to 120 Howard County Food Bank, Office on Aging and Independence, Head Start, and Public-School System clients. During the coming month, we know that the numbers will continue to climb.

How You Can Help

With the fee-for-service component of Neighbor Ride's transportation program largely shut down, we are projecting an impactful loss of revenue as the COVID-19 crisis persists. Updates and Information

When to Use the Emergency Line

Please leave a message on the Emergency Line when the Neighbor Ride office is closed if:

- You need to cancel a ride scheduled to take place within the next 12 hours
- You were not contacted by your driver the night before your ride or two different drivers contact you regarding the same ride (Please remember to check your answering machine before calling.)
- Your driver has not arrived at the scheduled time/place



Please do not leave messages that can be handled the next business day in the Emergency voicemail box. Non-emergency, after-hours calls may be left in Neighbor Ride's general voicemail box.

OFFICE HOURS: Monday–Friday 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. / Saturday 10 a.m. – 1p.m.

Fees are determined by the one-way distance, per Google Maps, between the pick-up location and destination. **If your income is limited, however, you may be eligible for subsidized rides. Please call the Neighbor Ride office for more information or to request an application.**

Volunteer Notebook

We love hearing our volunteers' stories and feedback about their experiences as Neighbor Ride drivers and thought you would enjoy them too. See below for just a handful of the comments and vignettes received as we have all responded to the COVID-19 crisis together:

"During the crisis period, I have been providing medical rides and making food deliveries on behalf of the Food Bank and the Office on Aging and Independence. On April 24th, when arriving at the 50+ Center to pick-up Grab & Go meals for delivery, I was greeted by 2 Easter bunnies. They were waving and when I stopped and rolled the window down, they both thanked me for what I was doing. It really made me feel warm all over."-**Paul**

"My origin story for 'why I drive' is because where we live and the way we live means transportation/access to it is essential for ALL. My dad's sentinel event that led to his hospitalization and diagnosis of Alzheimer's was behind the wheel. He LOVED to drive and drove way past it being safe – we, of course, did not know what was happening at the time. We used to say he had 'gasoline in his veins'. When I drive for Neighbor Ride, it is in part a tribute to my dad."-**Victoria**

"I'm doing 3 or 4 food deliveries a week from the Howard County Food Bank and Ellicott City 50+ Center, and only wish there were more to do. That's how much Neighbor Ride helps me feel as though I'm contributing in some small way to our community. I do miss the interaction with those we're helping, but trust that will return soon."-**Jeffrey**



We asked one driver, who regularly provides longer distance rides to medical appointments outside of the Columbia area, if there was on trip that particularly touched him. He responded, "My passenger was seeing her doctor for a follow-up evaluation to cancer treatment. She was declared 'Clean'." Cue tears of joy and gratitude from all of us at Neighbor Ride!"-**Bruce**

"As a two-time cancer survivor and older adult, I am at higher risk for COVID-19, so I'm not currently volunteering to drive passengers. I am, however, volunteering to deliver food. I like to think that if I was living alone and needed food that someone would step up to help. Everyone I have met has been so appreciative; and volunteering during the crisis has made me feel less isolated too."-**Kathy**

When asked what drives him to volunteer during the crisis, one volunteer responded, "People need help. I can help. All the rides – both food delivery and the limited medical ones I've provided, are so appreciated. One stands out for me because of how many times the recipient 'God Blessed' both me and Neighbor Ride."-**Greg**

"I've been happy to show up at short notice to deliver some meals and food, help out in a small way, and hopefully make a difference. I've been retired for 2 years, and part of the plan was always to try and set an example and give back in some way. I'm already looking forward to resuming my regular Neighbor Ride gig when this crisis has lifted! I'll look forward to seeing you all again in person. Until then, take care and be well."-**Charlie**
